## TRANSFER AGREEMENT Spring 2018

## Between Cape Cod Community College and Dean College

- 1. Dean College assures the acceptance of an associate degree graduate who has earned a grade point average of 2.0 or higher (on a 4.0 scale) into their baccalaureate degree programs in the following programs: Business Administration, Criminal Justice, English, History, Psychology, and Sociology/Anthropology. Students who are accepted with 60 transfer credits will be classified as juniors.
- 2. Transfer students will receive academic credit for all college-level courses applied toward the requirements of the associate degree, "C-" grades or higher. Non-credit or remedial courses adjudged to be below college level may not be accepted for transfer. A maximum of 90 credits will be accepted for transfer into a baccalaureate degree program; a maximum of 30 credits will be accepted for transfer into an associate degree program.
- 3. Students who completed Cape Cod Community College's general education requirements with grades of C-and higher in those courses will be considered as having fulfilled the Dean College 9-course lower division All-College Core. Precisely how these transferred credits will apply to the specific degree will be determined once the student declares a major.
- 4. Students who completed the major requirements for the associate degree at Cape Cod Community College, with grades of C- or higher in those courses, will be considered as having fulfilled the lower-division major requirements for the comparable Dean College baccalaureate degree program.
- 5. It is understood that if a student changes his/her major upon transfer to Dean College, and does not have the foundation or skill to enroll in an upper level course because he/she has not taken pre-requisite introductory courses, he/she will be required to take any necessary prerequisites(s). Therefore, Dean College cannot assure every student the completion of requirements for the baccalaureate degree in four semesters.
- 6. The Dean College catalog contains all information about degree requirements. Students wishing to plan their associate degree program to ensure meeting prerequisites for upper division courses are encouraged to communicate early with the transfer counselor at Dean College to secure specific information about transfer credits.
- 7. This agreement will be reviewed bi-annually and may be revised by mutual agreement.
- 8. The agreement is expected to continue in force indefinitely but may be terminated by either party with not less than one year's notice.
