Articulation Agreement Between Cape Cod Community College and Fisher College

- 1. Fisher College assures the acceptance of Cape Cod Community College (CCCC) graduates or transfer students who have earned a grade point average of 2.0 or higher.
- 2. Transfer students will receive academic credit for all courses completed at CCCC that were applied toward their associates degree or certificate, if they enroll in the aligned Fisher College bachelor's degree (see Exhibit A). Up to 90 credits can be accepted.
- Cape Cod Community College will assure the curriculum as identified in Exhibit A is taught according to the published description and by a properly credentialed faculty member (master's degree required, doctorate degree preferred) including both academic and professional credentials.
- 4. Non-credit or remedial courses below college level may be accepted for transfer.
- 5. If a student does not have the foundation or skill to enroll in an upper level course because they have not taken introductory courses or achieved the required grade, the student will be required to take the necessary prerequisite(s). Therefore, Fisher College cannot assure every student the completion of requirements for the bachelor degree in a specific number of terms or semesters. However, students with the aligned associate degree from CCCC would be able to finish in two years if they follow the prescribed curriculum and course load and complete all classes satisfactorily.
- 6. The Fisher College catalog contains all information about the degree requirements. Students wishing to plan their bachelor degree program to ensure meeting prerequisites for upper level courses are encouraged to communicate early with an admissions counselor at Fisher College to secure specific information about their transfer credits.
- 7. This agreement will be reviewed every three years and may be revised by mutual agreement.
- 8. Both Fisher College and Cape Cod Community College agree to the right to use each other's names in print materials and media advertising. All materials must be approved by the respective communications and/or marketing offices at the partner college.

9. This agreement is expected to continue in force indefinitely but may be terminated by either party with not less than one year's notice.
